


Thanksgiving story

1) A group of 102 people, called the Pilgrim Fathers, in September 1620 sail from England on a ship called **"The Mayflower".** They land on the east coast of America, in Massachusetts, on November 10th.



2) They call the land "New England". Winter is very cold and they haven't food. The Indians help the Pilgrims to build houses, to cultivate corn, potatoes, and pumpkins and to hunt turkeys and deer.



3) After a good harvest, the Pilgrims thank the Indians. They make a feast and invite the Indians. They eat turkeys, corn, pumpkins, potatoes, and fish. It is **November 1621** and the feast lasts three days.



4)The Americans still celebrate this feast on <u>Thanksgiving</u> <u>Day</u>, on the fourth Thursday in November with a big <u>Thanksgiving dinner</u> and they eat <u>roast turkey</u>, <u>potatoes</u>, <u>cranberry jam and pumpkin pie</u>.
