In Great Britain people write Christmas cards for Christmas.



Carolers go from house to house and sing to collect money for charity. They sing Christmas songs: carols.



People decorate their house and put a wreath on their door.



They make a Christmas tree with balls lights



and candy canes, with a star or an angel on the top.



December 24th is called Christmas Eve.

Children wait for Santa Claus and they hang stockings at their bed or at the fireplace.



Father Christmas, also called Santa Claus, puts small presents and sweets in the stockings

Santa Claus delivers the presents during the night.



On Christmas day, in the morning they open the presents.



Before lunch people pull crackers. There are a little toy, a joke and a paper hat inside



For Christmas dinner they have turkey with potatoes and vegetables



The traditional dessert is a Christmas pudding or a Christmas cake
